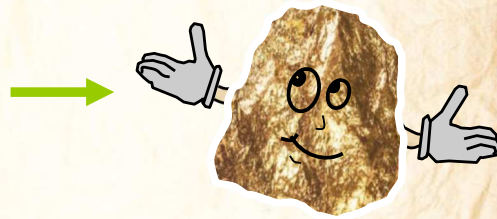

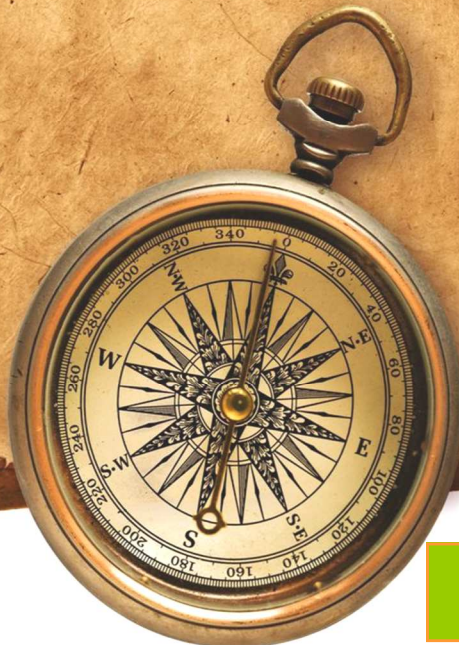

La Coquille is a village located on the north-east of the Dordogne department adjacent the Haute-Vienne and making it part of the Périgord-Limousin Regional Natural Park. It is a place where heritage, hills and rivers mix.

Historical

Until 1856, Sainte Marie de Frugie was the chief town of the commune.

The village of La Coquille being more central, more populated, had a post and postal relay, which would hinder a lot of activity. The council asked for the transfer to the hamlet of La Coquille. In 1860, La Coquille inaugurated its station which generated even more activity

This town is an essential place for pilgrims making the pilgrimage to St Jacques de Compostelle, moreover legend has it that the name of this place comes from a shell that would have been forgotten by a pilgrim making a stop there.

Cross the road and head to the Credit Agricole.



In 1882 the council decided to construct this building to make a school and a town hall.

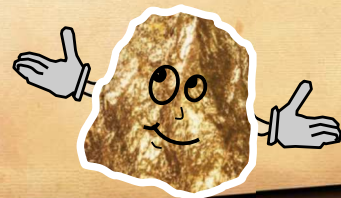

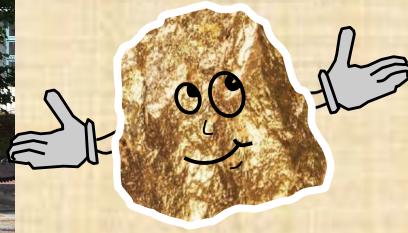

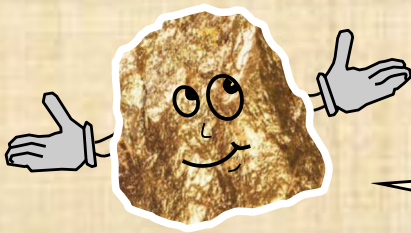




This monument was created in honor of all supporters of the 1st Dordogne North regiment.

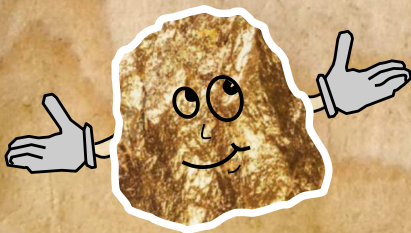

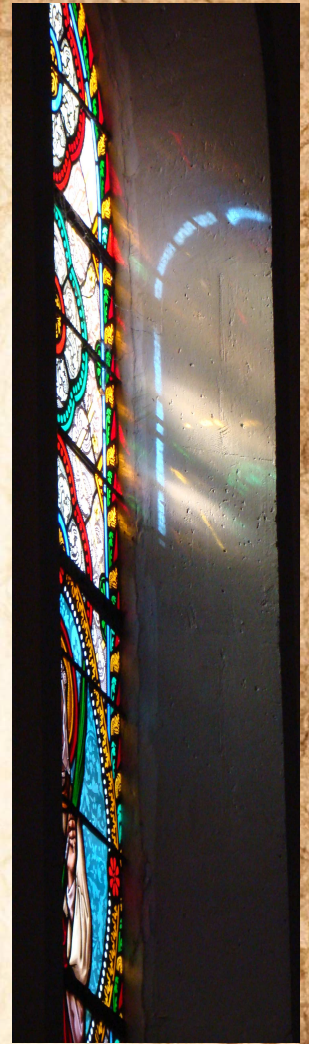
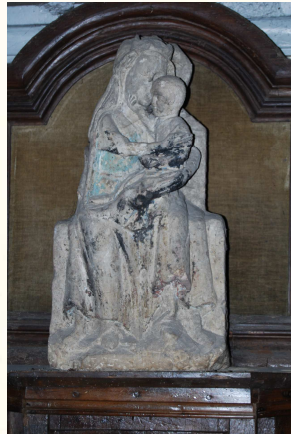
Go past the last buildings,

Church Saint Joseph.

This building was constructed in the 1870's thanks to a residents' subscription of 10 000 francs and a loan. It was built after the headquarters relocation of the commune of La Coquille.

There was a church at Saint Marie de Frugie, it was in ruins and was destroyed.

Part of the building was used from the old church.



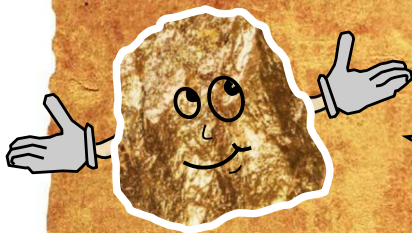
There is an inscription on the church clock.

On the bottom of the church wall you can find a Leveling Post, find it and write the altitude that is shown.



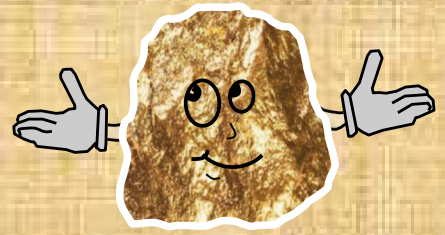

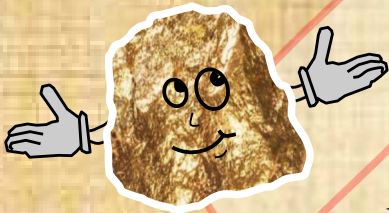
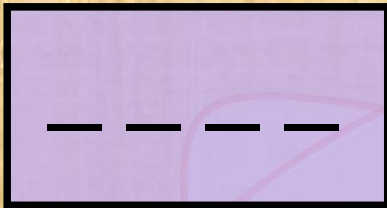
Go to the rue de la Boétie.

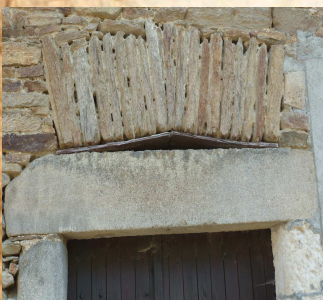
- A** **Slate**
Material in slate stone used for the roofs of buildings.



- B** **Discharge arc**
Element of architecture, which aims to lighten the weight of the wall on the lintel by pushing the loads to the sides. The discharge arches are often either stone, brick or wood.



- C** **Finial**
Roof ornament, placed on the ridge of the roof, used to cover the structural punch. .

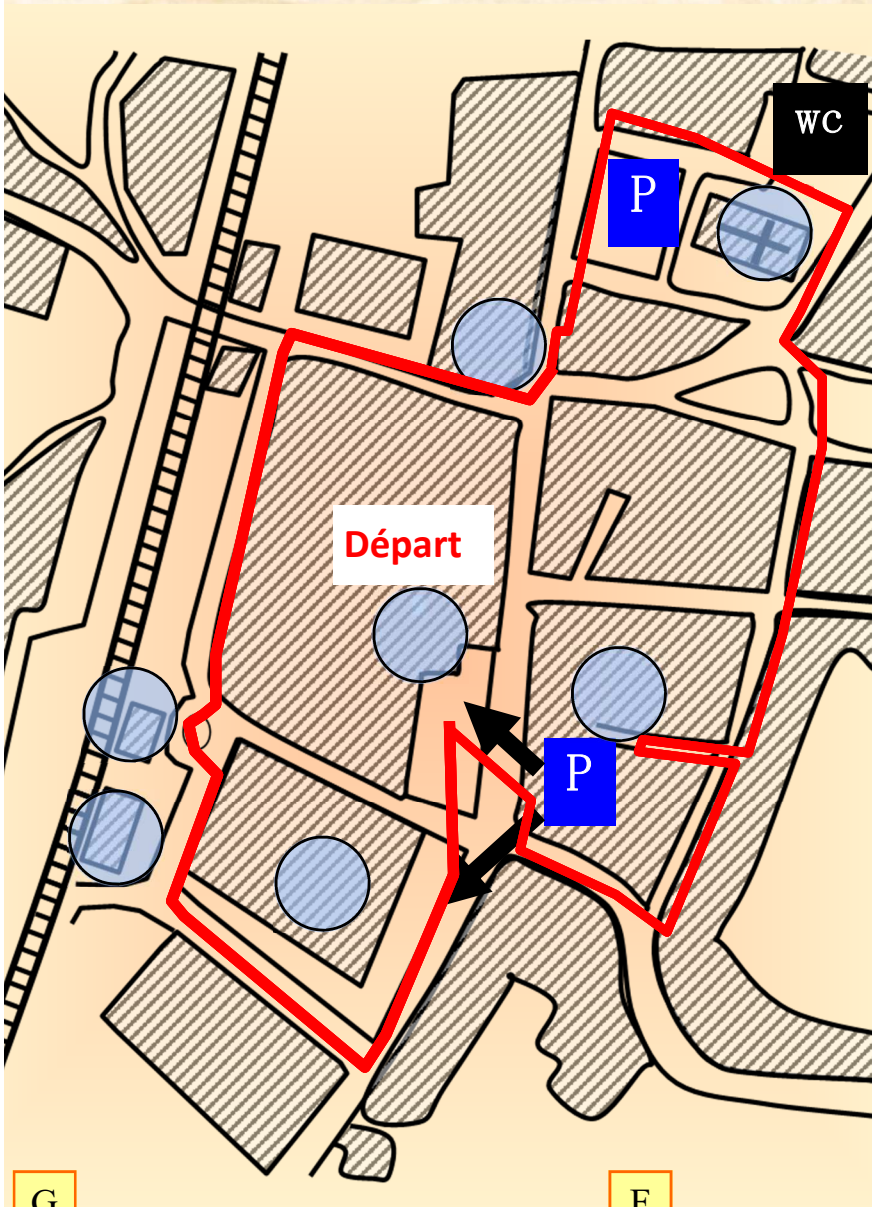


- D** **Memorial**
Monument destined to commemorate and honor the soldiers that died or went missing for France during different wars



- E** **Genoese**
Cornice composed of tiles intended to keep rainwater away from the facade and serving as decoration for the roof.
