Welcome to Thiviers in green Périgord.

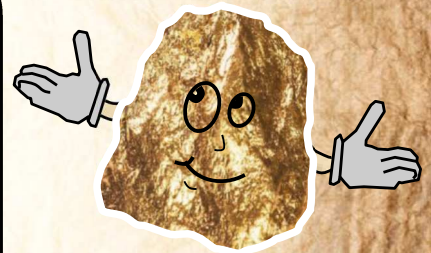
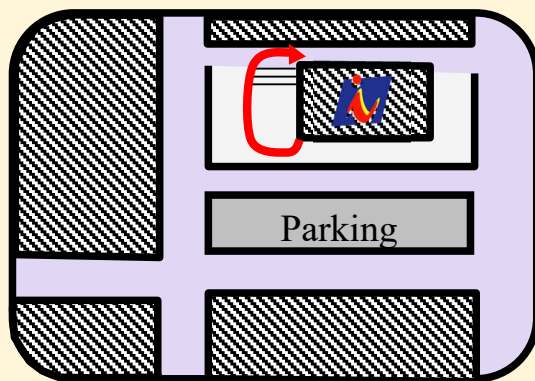
Located on the road to St Jacques de Compostelle, this town is rich in history and heritage.

When you leave the tourist office, go along it on the right, climb the steps and turn right, rue de Rochefort.

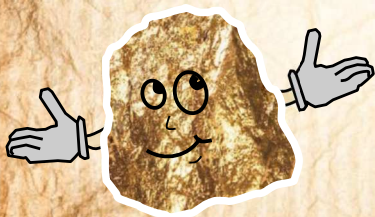


In this street, you can observe a beautiful stone and wood facade.

Put the letters in order to find the name of this architectural element.

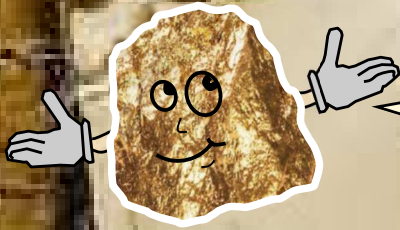

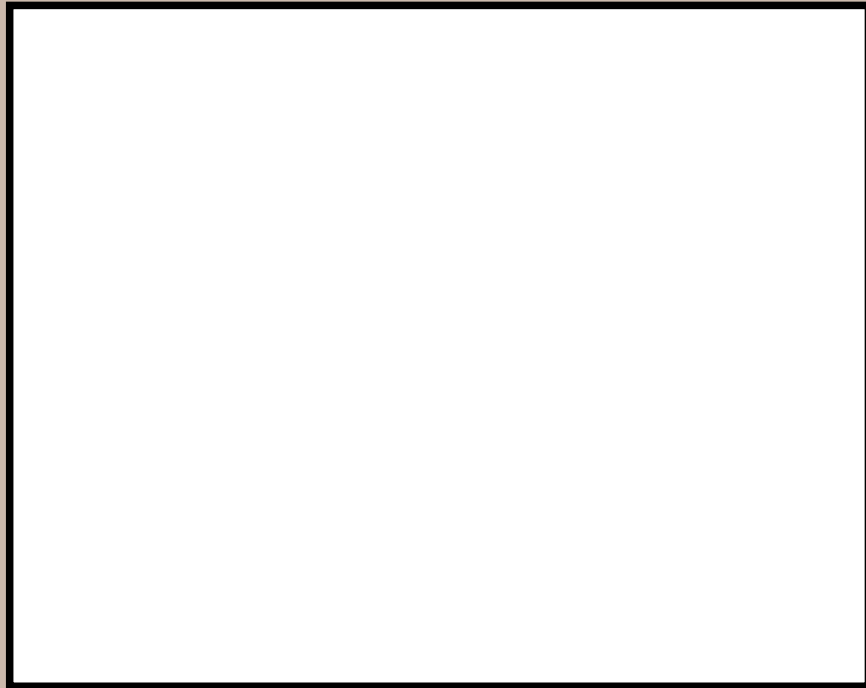
Turn left, and immediately after again left into a small alley :

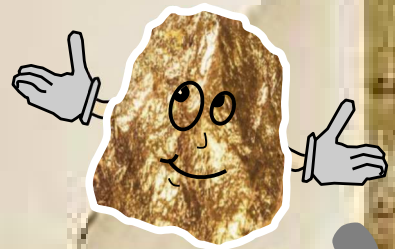


Take advantage of the crossing of this alley to observe here and there vestiges of houses of the XIV century.

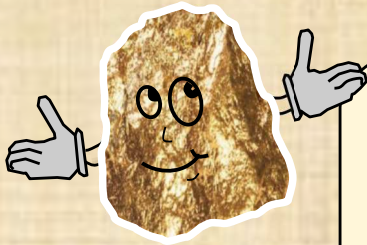
At the end of this street when you pass under the porch, a paving stone is different from the others.

Take opposite rue de l'Archet, and turn on the 2nd street on the right, rue du Puits de l'Archet.



Legend has it that an archer lived on this street. He would have trained himself to shoot with an arch on an apple placed on the edge of a well.



Arrived down the street, facing you, is the house at number 18, where was born a famous writer author of the book « Four of the middle course ». He also wrote a book of advice to young teachers in the form of dialogical, humourous and distanced fiction.

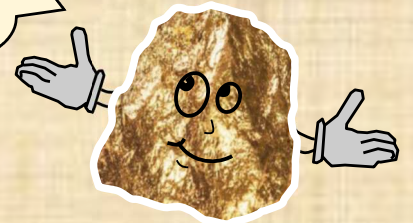

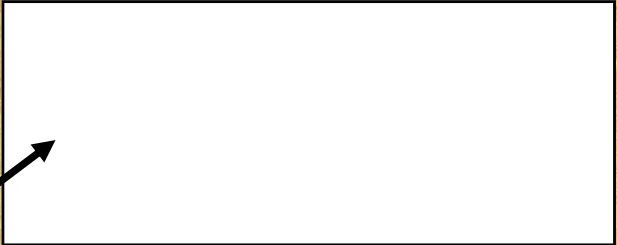
Go up the Rue du Général Lamy and turn left « rue du Grenadier ».

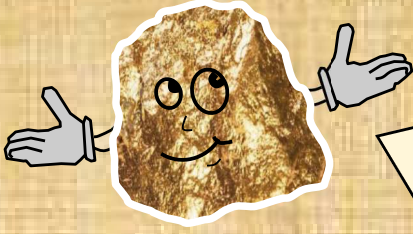
Go on your way. This time you are in front of the 16th century castle of Vaucocourt. Its foundations date from the 13th century.



How many mullion cross windows do you have (photo opposite) on the facade.

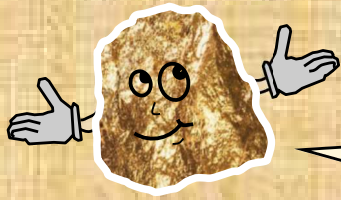

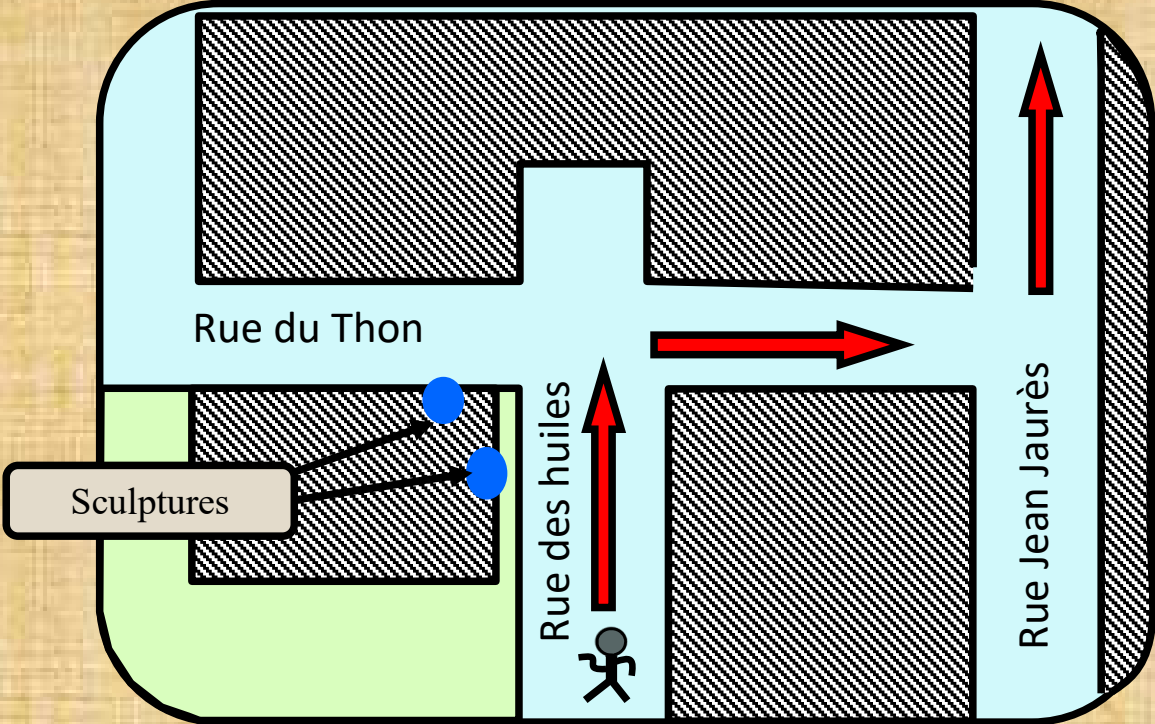


Continue on your way and turn to the next street on the left : « Rue des Huiles »
Formerly, a procession took place every May 22nd, the bell of the church « Ste Quitterie » was carried in the street.

Go along the wall, and there observe the last building on the left : the Bastardie « manor ».

A carved stone animal sits on the facade below a window.

Another sculpture is on the other side of the building, above a window.



Here you are in front of the old Ste Marie hospital or house of Hautefort which depended on the order of St Lazarus of Jerusalem (hospital order founded in Jerusalem in the 11th or 12th centuries to accommodate pilgrims with leprosy). This former leprosarium later became the home of the consuls.

Take it a little further in front, Rue André Gay.



Find the way to get Pépito.





Approach the house, and come in to take a look.



You can see two chimneys there. Look at the larger one and note the first name there as it is written.

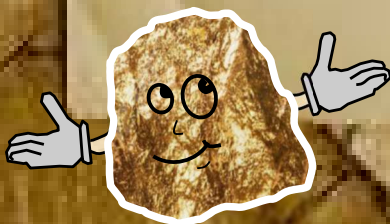


Continue on the street, you follow a low wall on your left.

Formerly this one was slightly inclined towards the ground. When running water did not exist, residents had found this system to collect rainwater on their land.



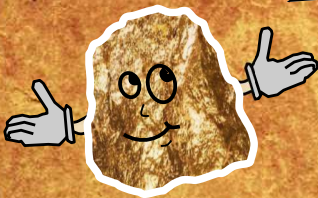
Follow the wall until the end. Look at the building on the right opposite.



A well is nested in the wall.
It only asks to be sketched below.



Continue to Place Jean Paul Sartre and
take the first lane on the right to join Rue
Jean Jaures, then turn left. .



Going up the street, stop in front of the estate
agency. High up on the wall is a commemorative
plaque of a famous person who lived a few years
in this town.

If you wish, you can go visit this building, one of the oldest in the town. You will be able to see there very beautiful Romanesque capitals and very beautiful sculptures, such as **St Jean Baptiste** classified « historic monument ».



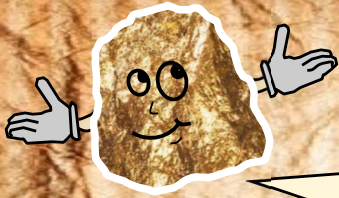

Outside the church are two fountains bearing the image of a pagan god. Find the instrument of the name of this god, which is composed of a set of sound pipes.



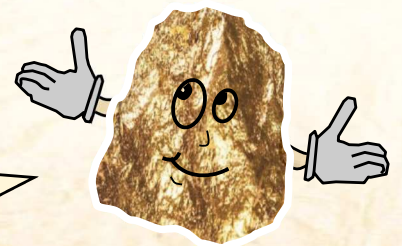

Still on the church, just before finishing the tour, not far from the ground is a terminal that tells you the level of place relative to the sea level.

Find the terminal and note opposite, the height.

Find the definitions by putting the right letter in the circles.



- A** Bull's-eye
Opening in a wall of a building, used to pass the light. The name comes from the shape of the bull's eye.



- B** Terminals-Fountains
Small fountain whose shape recalls that of a terminal, which served to supply the town with drinking water.



- C** IGN General Leveling Post.
Element where the altitude of the place is materialized and constitutes a network of altimetric landmarks scattered over the territory

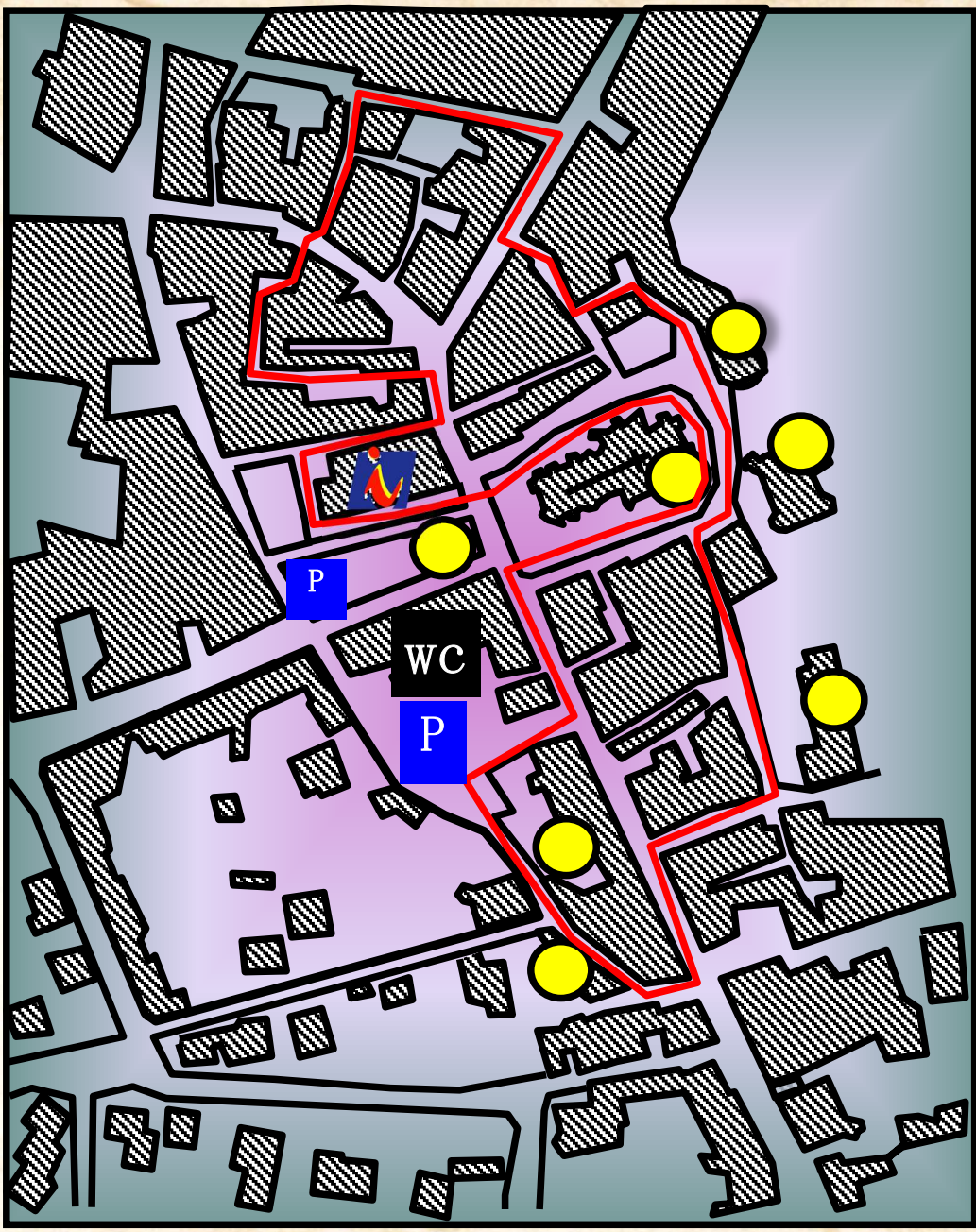
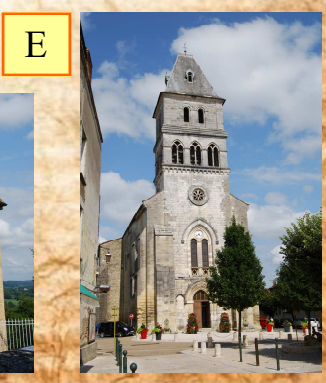
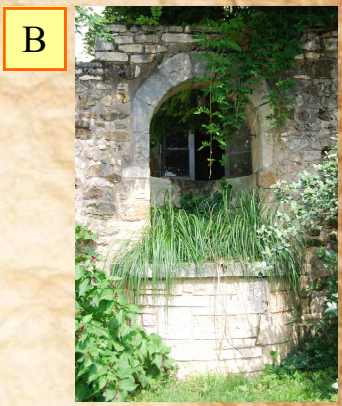


- D** Cross windows :
Opening in the walls of a building to let the light inside. Composed of two parts : a mullion which is a vertical structural element in ashlar, wood or iron which divides the bay from a window, and a 'cross' which shares the mullion.



- E** Genoese
Cornice composed of tiles intended to keep rainwater away from the facade and serving as decoration for the roof.
