

Located on the road to St Jacque de Compostelle, this town is rich in history and heritage.

Its origins date from the Gaulois era, in the VI-VII century, the town had the right to coin money.


Famous people lived in this place.

it on the right, climb the steps and turn right, rue de

Rochefort.





In this street, you can observe a beautiful stone and wood facade.





Above the large gates of this house is a worked stone, what do you think it was used for ?




Small clue, above, the wall has been rebuilt in brick... instead there was a window.

How many mullion cross windows do you have (photo opposite) on the facade.








Continue on your way and turn to the next street on the left: « Rue des Huiles »

Go along the wall, and there observe the last building on the left: the Bastardie « manor ».





Ste Marie hospital or house of
Hautefort which depended on the
order of St Lazarus of Jerusalem
(hospital order founded in Jerusalem
in the 11th or 12th centuries to
accommodate pilgrims with leprosy).
This former leprosarium later
became the home of the consuls.

Take it a little further in front, Rue André Gay.








Approach the house, and come in to take a look.



You can see two chimneys there. Look at the larger one and note the first name there as it is written.



Formerly this one was slightly inclined towards the ground. When running water did not exist, residents had found this system to collect rainwater on their land.



Follow the wall untill the end. Look at the building on the right opposite. A well is nested in the wall. It only asks to be sketched below.





Continue to Place Jean Paul Sartre and take the first lane on the right to join Rue Jean Jaures, then turn left.

Going up the street, stop in front of the estate agency. High up on the wall is a commemorative plaque of a famous person who lived a few years in this town.






Continue to go around the church looking at its wall about 3 to 4 meters in height.







Opening in a wall of a building, used to pass the light. The name comes from the shape of the bull's eye.



### B ( ) Terminals-Fountains

Small fountain whose shape recalls that of a terminal, which served to supply the town with drinking water.



### IGN General Leveling Post.

Element where the altitude of the place is materialized and constitutes a network of altimetric landmarks scattered over the territory



#### Cross windows:

Opening in the walls of a building to let the light inside. Composed of two parts: a mullion which is a vertical structural element in ashlar, wood or iron which divides the bay from a window, and a 'cross' which shares the mullion.




#### Genoese


Cornice composed of tiles intended to keep rainwater away from the facade and serving as decoration for the roof.


